## Cindy McCain

Public Life of a Spouse of a Politician

**C**indy Hensley McCain, a native Arizonian, attended Madison Elementary School and Central High School in Phoenix. She received her undergraduate degree in Education and her Master's degree in Special Education from the University of Southern California. While attending USC, Cindy participated in early pilot programs testing movement therapy, which is now a widely accepted standard for working with severely disabled children. After graduating from USC, she began her teaching career at Agua Fria High School in Avondale, Arizona. In 1980, she married John McCain III.

As an advocate for children's health care needs, Cindy founded

the American Voluntary Medical Team (AVMT) in 1988. The AVMT provided emergency medical and surgical care to impoverished children throughout the world. She led 55 medical missions to third world and war-torn countries during AVMT's seven years of existence.

Cindy is the daughter of long-time Arizona residents, Marguerite and the late Jim Hensley. She currently serves as Chairman of her family's business, Hensley & Company - one of the largest Anheuser-Busch Distributors in the nation. Cindy lives in Phoenix with her husband U.S. Senator John McCain, (former republican presidential candidate), and their four children: Meghan, Jack, Jimmy, and Bridget.

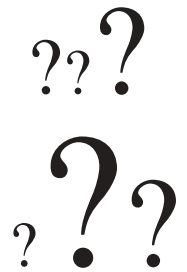

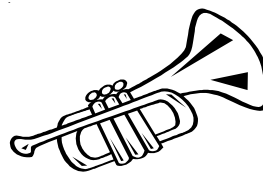

In President **Mike Hosking's** absence, **Curtis Jennings**, currently Vice-President, welcomed a full house of luncheon guests at 12:25 PM sharp. It was a crowd in which invited guests appeared to outnumber regular members, a fact further stressed by **Jason Ebe** who, when asked to introduce today's visitors, simply asked them to stand and accept applause – they were too numerous to be individually identified.
